Above Noah is exploring the sensory table and we can see Lucy's selfie. Below Rory is with a smaller tiger...

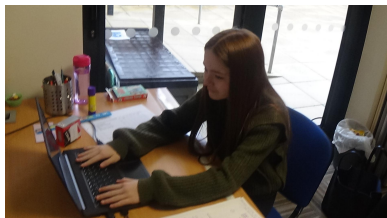


The coke and mentos experiment was explosive!

Learning news



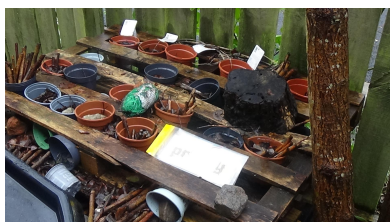
Cameron, Harrison and Noah visited the light exhibition at Queen Elizabeth Hall to engage and inspire this term's topic The world, places/countries.



Cameron built a model volcano in art with Kaitie. Here he is watching his volcano erupt! Thank you to Katie for all your exciting ideas and support this term.



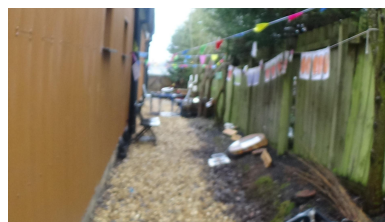

Jayden and Oliver discussed the purpose of such narrow windows and how these helped defend the castle under attack.

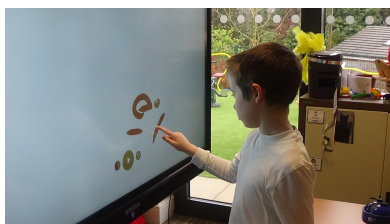


The weather was so much better on this postponed visit date!
